
#### A message from the President & Chief Executive Officer

#### Have you met Ruby?

This season, Ruby truly shone as the heart of our winter fundraising campaign. Her heartwarming story has made a lasting impact on our community. Thank you, Ruby, for sharing your inspiring story with the world!

"I had my daughter Evangeline at the age of 17. I started facing homelessness when Evangeline was about a year old. I was in and out of places, couch surfing, and so my Children's Aid Society worker was trying to help me find shelter.

All of the shelters were full in Toronto, so I had to go to Parry Sound. I was there for about a month and a half, until I could no longer stay at the shelter. I had to come back to Toronto and after months of couch surfing and living in shelters, I moved into Abiona Centre.

I've been at Abiona Center for almost a year now. They've helped me go back to school, they're been helping me find a job, and they are also helping my daughter with her speech and language.

Overall, my experience here at Abiona Center has been great. I'm very thankful for everybody and everything that they do."



#### **A Step Towards Independence**

In the Baby & Me: Our Home program, when a rent supplement spot becomes available, an eligible client is paired with the spot for a 3-month period, with the goal of signing a lease. If they sign a lease within this window, they can continue receiving the rent subsidy as long as they remain eligible.

In December, a young mom who has been receiving services at Abiona Centre for four years was selected for the spot. This client has worked hard to reach a point where they can live independently, having saved enough for first and last month's rent, as well as furniture. They will also be graduating from post-secondary studies this year and are now actively working with their community worker to secure a place.
